### **Emerging Philanthropy Leadership Award**

For an individual who is new to the philanthropic sector and whose leadership and contribution to the arts is shaping the future of philanthropy and private giving in Australia's cultural sector.

### **Arts Leadership Award**

For an individual working in the arts and cultural sector who through their leadership, advocacy, practice and example has made an exceptional contribution to promoting private sector's investment into Australia's cultural life; demonstrating vision, commercial acumen and strategic thinking in their engagement with donors and business, and encouraging increased giving to the arts.

### Philanthropy Leadership Award John Wylie AM and Myriam Boisbouvier-Wylie

The John and Myriam Wylie Foundation provides financial and non-financial support for worthy and well-run organisations in all walks of life, especially in education, arts and culture, youth and social inclusion, the indigenous community, sport and well-being, and selected community interests.

They have to date supported over one hundred organisations and causes. They aim to make an impact, not a statement, and seek to assist deserving organisations in meaningful ways over and above pure financial support.

John Wylie is Principal of alternative asset investment firm Tanarra, which invests in global venture capital, private equity, private credit and PE-style strategies in listed companies. He has 30 years' experience in the finance industry in Australia, the US and the UK. In the 1990s he was CEO of investment bank Credit Suisse in Australia. In 2000 he co-founded advisory and investment firm Carnegie Wylie & Company which was acquired by the global financial services firm Lazard in 2007, following which he served as CEO of Lazard Australia until launching Tanarra in 2015. John served as Chair of the Australian Sports Commission, the national government agency for sport in Australia, from 2012 to 2020; President of the State Library Victoria from 2012 to 2021; Chair of the Melbourne Cricket Ground Trust from 1999 to 2013; and Chair of the Redevelopment Committee of the MCG in the years preceding the 2006 Melbourne Commonwealth Games.

He was a Trustee of the Rhodes Trust scholarships at Oxford University from 2010 to 2019 and was appointed a Trustee Emeritus in 2019.

Originally from Monaco, Myriam Boisbouvier-Wylie practiced as a lawyer in Monaco until marrying John Wylie and moving to Australia in September 1996. In Australia, Myriam has been the Olympic Attachée to the Olympic Committee of Monaco for the Games of Sydney, member of the fundraising committee of the Eye Research Foundation of Melbourne and was for five years the President of the Parents' Association of the French school in Melbourne, before becoming its Honorary President. Since 2011, Myriam serves as Honorary Consul General of France in Melbourne. Myriam's involvement in both the French education and the French community has been recognised by the French Republic through her appointment as Chevalier de l'Ordre des Palmes Académiques and Chevalier de la Légion d'Honneur. She also received the Medal of Honour of the French Senate.



### Business Leadership Award Scott Hutchinson

Scott Hutchinson entered the family business full time as the fourth generation Hutchinson in 1986 and has been Chairman of Hutchinson Builders since 2001. In 2019, Hutchinson Builders won Philanthropist of the Year for its support of not-for-profit organisations including AEIOU, Bravehearts, National Association of Women in Construction, YoungCare and many other charities.

Most recently, it has been in Scott Hutchinson's personal interest in preserving Brisbane's live music scene that Hutchinson's philanthropic contribution has been most significant.

Scott recognised that inner-city live music venues across the world were in crisis as the value of land increased leading to their purchase and demolition to make way for residential highrises. In response to this, Hutchinson Builders has purchased several inner-city high-rise sites in order to build new music venues and support Brisbane's important live-music industry. The most significant of these is The Fortitude Music Hall which now anchors Fortitude Valley's live music precinct and importantly replaces the legendary Festival Hall which was demolished in 2003 for a high-rise residential project.

Scott was on the board of QMusic from 2005 to 2017 and has since been named its official Patron. Over the years, his passion for live music has seen him sponsor and support young bands and music festivals throughout Queensland.



### **Emerging Philanthropy Leadership Award** Nick and Sophie Dunstone

Nick and Sophie Dunstone returned to their home state of South Australia in 2018 with their four children after twenty years living interstate and overseas. The COVID-19 international travel embargo created an opportunity for Nick and Sophie to focus on the impact their philanthropy could have on their local community.

Nick and Sophie recognised that COVID-19 created a need for investment in the arts and hospitality in Adelaide, as industries that were both deeply affected by the crisis. In response to this need, they established Light Cultural Foundation Limited in 2020 as a not-forprofit arts charity. Nick and Sophie purchased the heritage building at 63 Light Square in the heart of Adelaide's west end and began renovating it into a space where arts and immersive technology could combine to create innovative new experiences. The first immersive performance venue, The Lab, opened in 2021 and provided artists with a canvas to experiment and create works using immersive technology.

The Foundation will continue its work through a newly opened Virtual Production Studio on level 1 of the Light Square building to test new technologies in preparation for the construction of future performance venues. Alongside The Lab and Virtual Production Studio, Nick and Sophie have built hospitality businesses within complex to promote local business and reinvest funds into the creative project.



### Arts Leadership Award Chris Howlett and Adele Schonhardt, Melbourne Digital Concert Hall

### Chris Howlett and Adele Schonhardt are Co-Directors of Melbourne Digital Concert Hall (MDCH), a ticketed livestreaming platform created to support the Australian music industry as venues around the globe went dark.

Launched on 27 March 2020 in response to limited performance opportunities during the pandemic, MDCH has generated over \$1.6 million for Australian musicians and arts workers, presenting 400 livestreamed concerts nationally and featuring almost 1,500 individual artists – many of whom weren't eligible for financial support. It has grown so rapidly that it will officially become ADCH – the Australian Digital Concert Hall – with the launch of the 2022 season.

Long-time friends and collaborators, Adele and Chris first crossed paths at Melbourne radio station 3MBS, where they've served as current and former Chair of the Board. Between them, they combine decades of experience in performance, artistic planning, broadcasting and arts management. Chris is an award-winning cellist, Director of the Sanguine Estate and Bendigo Chamber Music Festivals and Founder of Australia's largest exporter of classical music to China. Adele is an arts, media and public affairs manager with a career spanning venues, orchestras and organisations in Germany, Australia and the USA.
